**2 Chronicles 20:1 ...The children of Moab, and the children of Ammon, and with them other beside the Ammonites, came against Jehoshaphat to battle. 2 Then there came some that told Jehoshaphat, saying, There cometh a great multitude against thee from beyond the sea...**

So far, this has a distinct note of familiarity. Each of us has faced crisis at one time or another (or many others). Judah cries out to the Lord "O our God, ...we have no might ...neither know we what to do", vs.12.

There is a remarkable progression between this cry and vs.27's conclusion, "... then they returned... again to Jerusalem with joy; for the LORD had made them to rejoice over their enemies." **Note this vital progression.**

3 And Jehoshaphat...set himself to seek the LORD. 4 And Judah gathered themselves together...to seek the LORD. 12 O our God, ...our eyes are upon thee. 13 And all Judah stood before the LORD. 15 Thus saith the LORD unto you, Be not afraid nor dismayed by reason of this great multitude; for the battle is not yours, but God's. 17 Ye shall not need to fight in this battle: set

yourselves, **stand ye still**, and see the salvation of the LORD...

What does God mean by “stand still?” To be inactive? Dormant? No!

18 And Jehoshaphat bowed his head with his face to the ground: and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem **fell before the LORD, worshipping the LORD**. 19 Then some...stood and **praised the LORD**, the God of Israel, **with very loud voice**. 21 ...He appointed singers unto the LORD, and that should praise... as they went out **before the army**. 22 And when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments against Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir... and they were smitten. 27 Then they returned... again to Jerusalem with joy; for the LORD had made them to rejoice over their enemies.

It is essential to note that although God told them “stand still”, this didn’t mean to do nothing. Their own actions played a vital role in the conclusion. Their triumph was not simply the result of a sovereign decision; their worship played an essential part in the outcome.
