Mat. 12:34 KJV, ...Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh. 35 A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things. 36 But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. 37 For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.

There is an aspect of the “words” discussion— the “confession” discussion that often is not sufficiently explored. Nothing happens simply because you say it enough. The power of suggestion is not a Godly spiritual force.

When **out of the abundance of the heart**, the mouth speaks, something will always happen. God designed words to be creatively power-filled in that way. It is a heart matter. The empowering of the words is directly related to the connection to the heart. Are all words necessarily from the heart? No.

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Often casual words can be a more accurate heart reflection than calculated words. One person may say to another, “You are a great guy,” yet turning away mutter, “What a jerk.” Which statement reflected the heart? One was from the heart, the other not. Often the casual words, “idle” words are not calculated or premeditated. The calculated words frequently have no connection whatsoever to the heart.

James 3 indicates that a spring cannot bring forth both bitter and sweet but the mouth can and this ought not be—signifying that not every word has the same level of force. The “great guy” statement was actually a lie, not because of the guy’s character but because the words were deceptive, not heart-reflective.

Apparently God intends for every word we speak to be an accurate, power-filled reflection of a faith-filled heart not simply an empty, calculated cliché—and He holds us responsible accordingly.
